I know that many of you have been waiting for the report of the recent inspection and today the report was sent home with each child. The report will be published on 27th June on Ofsted's website.

The inspection guidance is clear on the possible outcomes for schools that were graded 'good' in their last two day inspection, which we had in April 2015. They cannot move into the 'outstanding' grade during a one day inspection which we had recently – that is the legislation.

The best outcome that 'good' schools can hope for is to remain at good with the possibility of a further two day inspection in the near future to see if we can achieve an outstanding grade. That is the outcome we achieved and we are delighted.

The inspection was very thorough and fair. It recognises the many successes we have, the improvements we make each year and praises the team. I have been part of many OFTSED inspections and read many other reports. There are not many reports as positive as this, but in my opinion, there are not many schools as amazing as ours!
