Our youngest children thrive in Nursery and Reception and make remarkable progress from their starting points.

We have been looking at ways to develop our curriculum further to give our older children more ownership of their learning, developing their understanding by working closely with others. He has been very impressed with their skills, attitudes and abilities. If skills like balance and coordination are developed early, then our children will be able to tackle more complex skills as they work their way through school.
