Year 4's visit to Durham

Dr Greenwell's Class had a great day on Tuesday, where they visited the Oriental Museum to learn more about their topic, Ancient Egyptians. I know they are enjoying this topic and I have already seen the children wrapping Dr Greenwell, Mrs McIntyre and Mr Foster as mummies! The children were amazed to see real life mummies and were allowed to handle authentic Egyptian artefacts.

The day began with a visit to the cathedral as part of their RE topic 'Places of Worship'. The children learnt about the meaning of the stained glass windows, role-played a baptism and were given a tour around the building to understand the key points in a Christian church.

They were visited this week by Cloud Singh who talked to the children about Sikh's beliefs and traditions.
