

This weekend our real Christmas trees will be erected in a school & Nursery ready for pupils to decorate. If your child wants to send Christmas cards to friends they can post them in our communal post boxes (in Nursery & School) or hand them out individually. If you require help with class names then ask your child's teacher.

THE CHILDREN MAKING MOST PROGRESS IN THEIR MATHS THIS TERM ARE THOSE SUPPORTED BY THEIR PARENTS. ARE YOU DOING ENOUGH TO HELP THEM PRACTISE?

IN KEY STAGE 1 when they know facts such as 8+2=10 then they are ready for turning this round e.g. 10-2 is.... 10-8 is.....Can they focus on 8+....=10 etc. Then move onto 80+....=100

In early Key Stage 2 can children work out how many more is 24 than 16, what is the difference between 35 and 42, if a packet of sweets cost 23p what will 2 packets/10 packets/ 5 packets cost.

How many packets can I buy if I have £1? Will I have any change, what will this be. Think of examples to keep brains sharp.

Y5 & 6 practice your timed tests, learn your tables, investigate fractions of numbers, and order decimal numbers.

LOOK AT LEVEL PROMPT SHEETS for practice examples & get your children to explain how to tackle the questions. Practice FRACTIONS into DECIMALS & vice versa. PRACTISE TELLING THE TIME!
