
### Ofsted called this week....

Thank you to all those parents who filled in the online questionnaire at such short notice. Your views are important. Mrs Bainbridge is not able to let you know the outcome of the inspection yet until the report is drafted, checked and available. Nursery children were wonderful - they were so focussed and well behaved when the inspector called. They talked freely to him showing off our achievements and learning in Nursery.

We are so proud of them all.

# This week we have been investigating Frogs and learning about their life cycle. Miss Mitchell brought in frogspawn and the children have checked every day for tadpoles – we have got three now! We've sung rhyming songs, made frog lolly stick puppets, played in slime, created a holiday house complete with swimming pool, counted frogs, made mud hot chocolate.



This week we are investigating plants, planting seeds and learning how plants grow and what they need.

### **Sounds & Letters**

We are continuing to introduce letter sounds in a fun and informal way. Last week we introduced the sound 'o' for Rabbits and 'b' for Owls. This week it will be 'u' and 'j'. Remember that we learn the sound of the letter at this stage rather than the alphabet name. Owls are also learning to read the letters.

### Reminders:

- Reception class Induction meeting will be held in School at 6pm 23<sup>rd</sup> May. You should already have received a letter from school.
- Reception class visit is the morning of Friday 12<sup>th</sup> July –
  please let us know if your child is attending and also if
  they require lunch care or an extra session at nursery
  on that day.
- If your child has had a sickness bug it is a county requirement that they are kept off nursery for 48hrs, after the last time they were sick, to avoid spreading infection.

### **Outdoor Environment**

Our outdoor area is changing all the time we are continually looking for ways to improve and stimulate outdoor learning as part of the EYFS curriculum. The bug hotel is now finished and guests are starting to move in. We have put up a caterpillar mirror on the fence and our next job is to plant some pots with flowers to attract more insects.

Work has started on the veranda – making it a more useful area for role play and table top activities. Our future projects include a wildlife area with wild flowers and grasses and a number caterpillar painted on the floor.
