If you notice your child has very red cheeks or a small rash, headache or aching joints it could be symptoms of SLAPPED CHEEK, diagnosed in the Barnard Castle area by local GPs.

Should children develop scabs near mouths or noses it is likely to be Impetigo. This is highly contagious so seek medical advice.

Remember to ring in with illnesses on the first morning before 10.00a.m.
