Attendance Awards

The attendance certificates arrived and we were able to hand out 91 certificates for 100% attendance. Well done everyone! There are well-researched links between attendance and children's progress. Most children's attendance is considerably over 90% and as a school from Y1-Y6 (the measure OFSTED uses) our attendance this year is over 97%!

Inspiring Curriculum

We have done a lot of work on the curriculum this year and it is something that we will continue to develop. As I visited the classes this week it was amazing to see the children's knowledge and skills developing in different subjects. For example, building on the children's prior knowledge, Mrs Newton's class have built a huge, collaborative Bowes Museum and in art have sculpted Silver Swans! In Year 1 they have made draw bridges using pulleys, building on their earlier castles topic and these are amazing. In Year 6, I noted some beautiful water colours that the children have created. It is important that we give the children opportunities to develop in all subjects if we want the next generation of engineers, artists, computer programmers and more.

Athlete Visit

On Thursday 28th November, GB Athlete Charlie Myers is visiting our school. Charlie is a professional Pole Vaulter and this year he came 5th at the European U23 Athletics Championships. Charlie will be running a fitness activity circuit for all children to take part in. We hope that you can support and encourage your child by sponsoring them to complete the activities. The money raised will provide school with some new sports equipment and support Charlie Myers on his journey towards the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. We look forward to this fantastic event!

Resilience Work

One area we have been keen to develop with our Year 6 children is around resilience. Miss Richardson and I arranged for some sessions with Barnard Castle School and this week half of the class did some activities with a Sergeant Major and the cadets! They came back very enthusiastically and Miss Richardson was very proud of their behaviour and attitude during the session. The other half of the class will go next week.
