Who were the Romans and where did they rule?

The Romans were one of the most powerful, clever and successful ancient civilisations ever.

They ruled over nearly all of Europe and most of North Africa, including Egypt.

If you counted all the modern countries that would have been in the Roman Empire, then you would be counting 48 different countries ruled by the Romans.



The Roman Empire

The Roman Empire lasted for over 1000 years. When the Roman civilization began in 753 B.C. the Egyptian civilisation had already been going for 3000 years! However, the Roman civilisation was more advanced in its technology than Egypt; and the Romans had the best fighting army in the history of the ancient world.




The Roman Empire started in Rome, Italy.











A map of Europe and North
