We are brilliant at jumping. Our feet are huge and we could jump right across the room in one jump! Can you jump like a kangaroo?

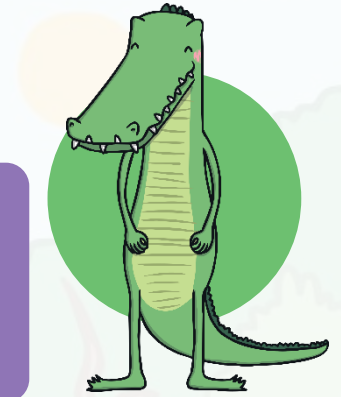


We are similar to koalas as we look after our babies in a pouch on our tummies until they can look after themselves.

We lay eggs and when our babies hatch out, we call them puggles.

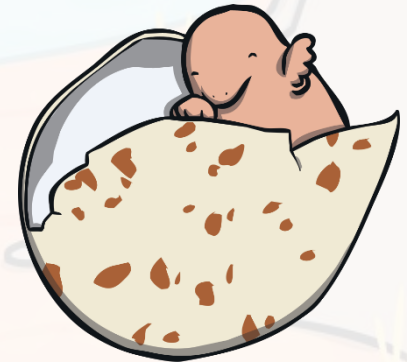

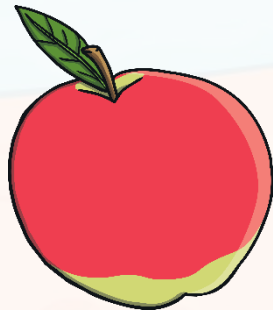


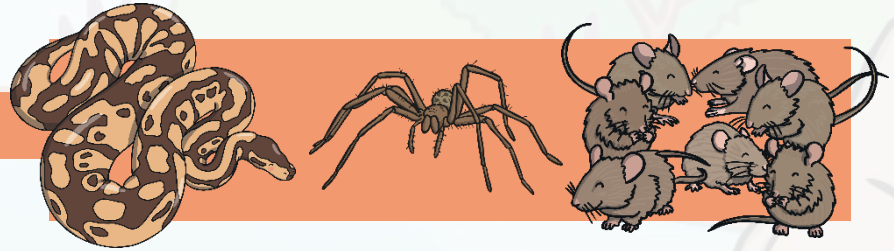

Our favourite foods are snakes, spiders and mice. We make a very strange sound like a person laughing! Can you make a noise like a kookaburra?



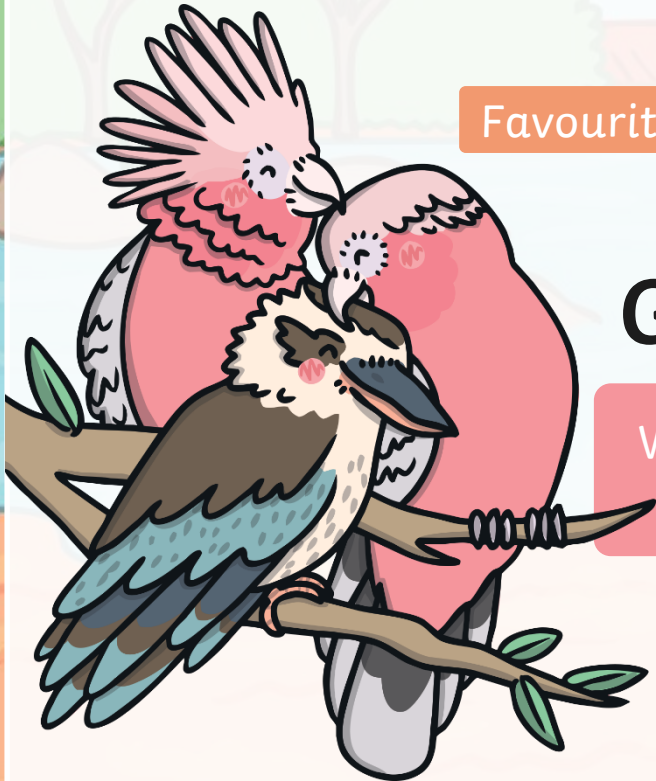

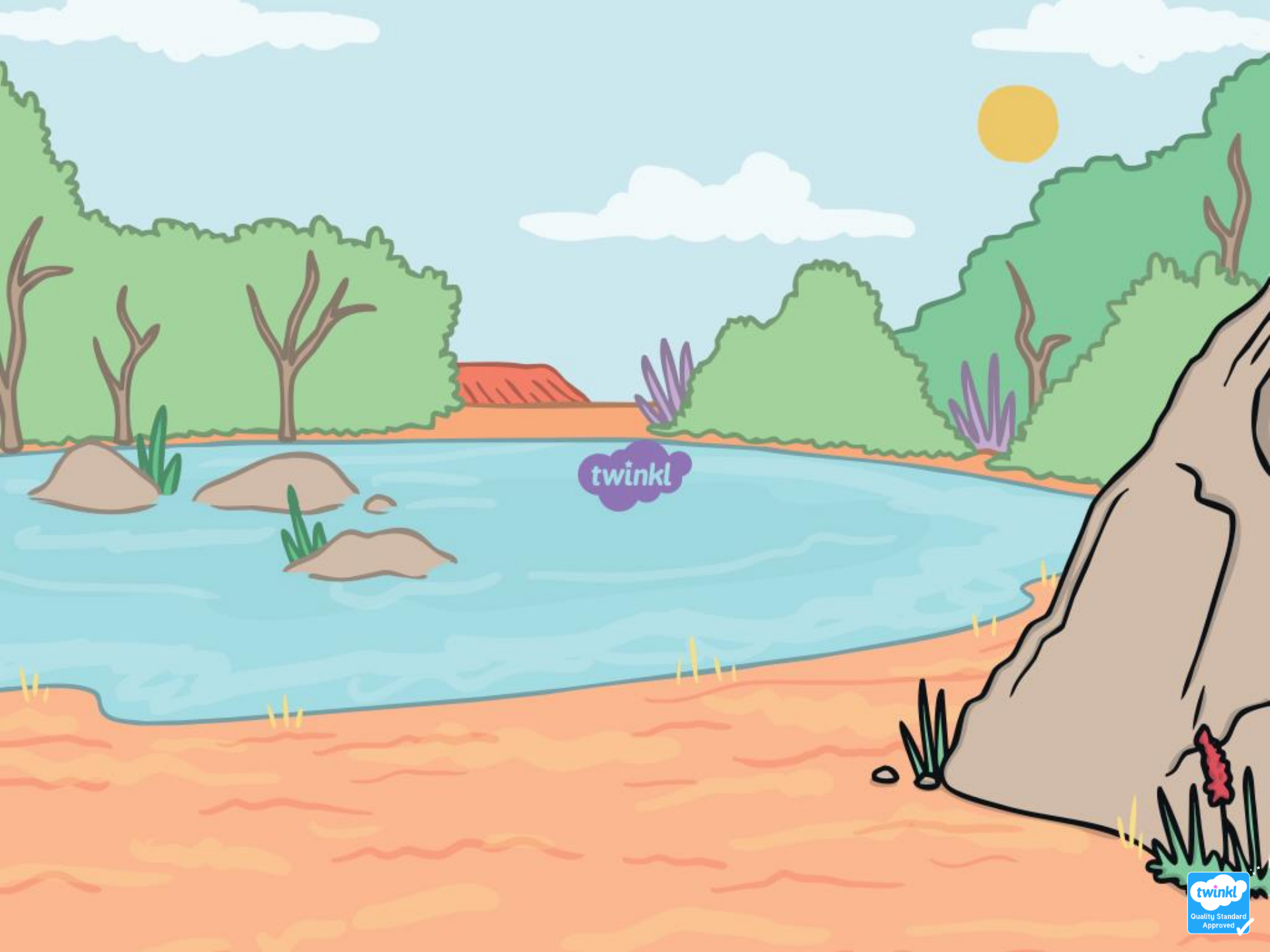
