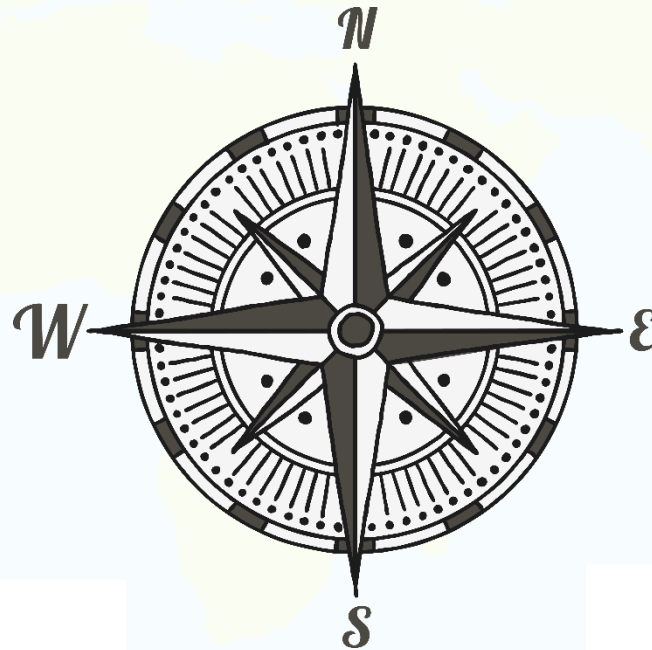
What is a journey line?

Making My Own Journey



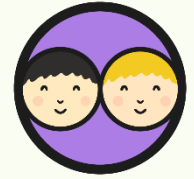
Use your world map to plot your own journey line and create your own boxes in your book to record your journey.

Around The World In 80 Days



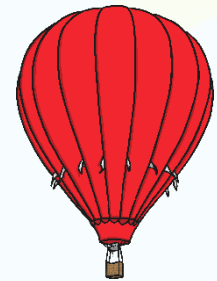

Today we can easily travel the world in just a few days but in the 1800's there was no air travel, or high speed railways!

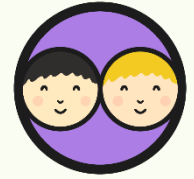

Hong Kong to Yokohama	Steamer	6 days
Yokohama to San Francisco	Steamer	22 days
San Francisco to New York	Rail	7 days
New York to London	Steamer and rail	9 days
