### Wellbeing

### **Online Safety and Behaviour**

As a school, we teach our children about acceptable online behaviours and each class from Y1-6 will have covered elements of online safety since September. In addition to this, encouraging online safety and positive behaviours online needs to continue at home. It is advisable that parents monitor the sites that their children access, the videos they are watching and the online conversations/messages that they send one another. There are often videos available to view which on the surface appear harmless, but their content can be far from it, so please ensure that you and your child discuss online safety regularly and what to do if they feel uncomfortable with videos, content or messages.

As part of our wider work on wellbeing, I think teaching the children to explore other interests and switching devices off is vitally important and parents can help with this too.

### Statutory Assessment Update

This week schools were notified that there will be no end of Key Stage 1 tests for children in Year 2. This was intended to be the last year in which these assessments were being taken. The only assessments in Key Stage 1, therefore, are the Phonics screening for both Year 1 and Year 2. Year 2 have to be assessed this term as the screening was cancelled for all schools in the Summer.

We were also informed that the Key Stage 2 Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar test for Year 6 is cancelled. Science is not to be assessed either for Key Stage 1 or 2. I will keep parents of Year 6 up to date with any further changes.
