


Our theme is ‘People Who Help Us’ and our story is ‘Zog and the Flying Doctors’

Please use these ideas as a basis for your child’s learning at home. Remember to also take time to observe your child and to follow their individual needs and interests. When your child is completing any writing tasks please encourage them to sound out each word using the sounds that they know. Although this will often be the incorrect spelling it is a crucial skill that they must develop, as they have not yet learned all of their sounds.

<p>Can you listen to the story ‘Zog and the Flying Doctors?’ https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2o6sFMw9A8A</p> <p>Wednesday: Did you enjoy the story? Can you remember what happened? Explain to an adult or someone in your house what happened in the beginning, middle and end of the story.</p> <p>Thursday: Can you remember the characters from the story? What were their names? Draw them and try and write their names. You could even just label them with the first sound in their name. Remember, we don’t need to spell everything correctly, as long as we are sounding words out using the sounds that we know 😊</p> <p>Friday: What was your favourite part of the story? Can you draw your favourite part and tell an adult why you liked it? You could also try and write why it was your favourite. This can be sounds, one word, a caption or short sentence.</p> 	<p>This week we are recognising numerals to 10. Watch the video below: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xinlymFLSdM</p> <p>Some of us are very confident with counting up to and past 10 but we need to practice recognising the numeral and writing it.</p> <p>Wednesday: Using ‘number cards to 10’ can you play splat? You can print the cards off or look at them on screen. You need to shout out the number as quickly as you can once you see it. Practise this with different numbers.</p> <p>Thursday: Look at the ‘counting in Space’ powerpoint. Using your cards from yesterday, choose a number. Which number is it? Can you count out that many objects at home. You could count toys, sweets, pasta or even socks. Try this with different numbers.</p> <p>Friday: Use ‘Recognising numerals’. You can print this off or use it at home. Can you count the images and select the correct numeral?</p> <p>Challenge: If you find recognising numerals to 10 very easy, you can try similar activities using bigger numbers. You can also practice writing your numerals to 10 using the rhymes on your number cards.</p>	<p><u>Daily speed sounds lesson</u></p> <p>Please access your child’s daily phonics teaching using the link below: https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLDe74j1F52zTYEYHmhC68VV_LVvzu-imu</p> <p>Your child should watch the following videos daily, focusing on a different sound each day: Set 2 speed sounds with Rosie. Set 2 Spelling with Rosie.</p> <p>Please also practise your red words at home daily. . <u>Please see attached the Oxford Owl guide sheet to access RWI books needed for the following activities. You should be using the Ditty/Story that matches the colour of your child’s home reading book. Please see ‘Reading books’ if you are unsure of which book your child should be using. If your child has a picture book or sound blending book, then please see the document named ‘Phonics Pre-reading’ on our ‘Home Learning’ tab of the website. Most books have more than one story/ditty. Please only read one story/ditty within each book per week.</u></p> <p>Wednesday: Read story 1/ditty 1 (using the guide above) to an adult. Choose four words from the story and write them down and think of a word that rhymes with each word you have chosen.</p> <p>Thursday: Read the story/ditty again. Can you answer the questions at the back of the book with the help of an adult?</p> <p>Friday: Read the story/ditty again.
