Fire Service and Police Visit

This week we enjoyed a visit from the Fire Service who worked with each class explaining the dangers of fire and how to react in different situations. They gave the children advice around handling sparklers and the importance of going to organised bonfire events rather than having fireworks at home. The children then had the chance to ask questions, sit in the Fire Engine and squirt the hose. They had a great time! The Fire Service complimented our school on the children's knowledge, attitude and behaviour. Well done Team Monty!

PCSO Singh also attended for part of the morning and worked with the older children, discussing anti-social behaviour: identifying what is anti-social behaviour, how to behave in public, littering and much more. He also spoke to the children about online behaviours and what to do if they were unhappy with the behaviour of others online. He also reminded the children of the age certificates on sites like Instagram and Snapchat which is 13 years old.

Year 2 visit to the Bowes Museum grounds

Yesterday Year 2 enjoyed a visit to the Bowes Museum grounds to make some field sketches of some of the geographical features of the beautiful surroundings. They did so well in such testing weather conditions – drawing on soggy clipboards was not easy. Today we had an inspirational Cricket Assembly from Mr Walker from Barnard Castle Cricket Club and Miss Henderson who is an Apprentice Teaching Assistant here at school. Miss Henderson also volunteers at the club and informed the children of new cricket sessions which will begin for Year 4, 5 and 6 at Teesdale Sports Centre on Friday October 8th between 6-7pm. Covid 19

It is really important that parents/carers do not send their child to school with any of the following symptoms. If you have COVID-19, you should not be bringing your child to school yourself and should arrange for others to bring and collect your child.

Please take a cautious approach at this time: -

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

The basic principles are if your child has COVID 19 or any of the COVID 19 symptoms they should not be attending school. A link for ordering PCR tests is here or you can also telephone 119. It is advisable to have the test as quickly as possible and report the outcome to school as soon as possible.
