

Policy Statement on School Uniform

1 Introduction

- **1.1** This document outlines the school views on School Uniform as informed by the:
 - Special Educational Needs Policy
 - Equality, Diversity and Community Cohesion Policy
 - Health and Safety Policy

2 Definition

2.1 All staff and pupils will be expected to adhere to this policy, with the exceptions to the use of uniform for Religious, cultural beliefs, SEN or disability.

3 Scope

3.1 This document applies to all children in school, regardless of age, ability, gender, race and faith.

4 Aims:

- Pupils are easily identified as a member of Montalbo Primary School
 - Pupils are proud to wear the uniform of Montalbo Primary School
 - Pupils are correctly dressed for PE
 - Pupils look smart at all times when representing the school.
 - To eliminate social inequality in dress
 - To safeguard children

5 Requirements and Expectations for Reception to Year 6 pupils

- 5.1 The uniform is ordered as required either by school or online.
- 5.2 The Montalbo Primary School Uniform is as follows:
 - Grey or black trousers/ skirt/ pinafore dress
 - Red polo shirt
 - Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan, preferably with the school logo
 - Black shoes
- **5.3** For indoor and summer outdoor PE, our PE kit is as follows:
 - Red T-Shirt
 - Navy shorts
 - Plimsoles or trainers

For Gymnastics sessions in the hall pupils will be expected to be bare footed.

For winter outdoor PE, our PE kit is as follows:

• Tracksuits and trainers

For children attending swimming, they should have an appropriate swimwear and towel.

5.4 Nursery children do not have to wear school uniform but we do offer a uniform should parents wish their child to wear one.

Please note: Pupils will not be allowed to wear tracksuits for indoor PE and affiliated football strips are not allowed to be worn in place of the above stated kit.

- **5.4** For Health and Safety reasons:
 - No jewellery can be worn for PE and all pupils are strongly encouraged not to wear jewellery on PE days.
 - Earrings and all other jewellery must be removed by the child before PE lessons.
 - Pupils who wear jewellery at school must fill in an indemnity form.
 - Newly pierced ears must be covered for 6 weeks and then earrings must be removed for PE lessons.
- **5.5** Pupils should not wear smartwatches to school due to their capabilities to take photographs, message or browse the internet.

6 Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

6.1 To ensure we cater for the needs of a child with SEND, exceptions can be made and the child will be able to wear clothes and shoes suitable to their needs.

7 Monitoring and Review

This policy will be reviewed on an annual basis.
