#### **Don Kent Visit**

Today we had an inspiring visit from Don Kent, a brother of explorer and scientist Robert Swan. He had visited Antarctica with Robert several times and told us about the conditions, wildlife and landscape. The children from Y1-6 really enjoyed Don's stories, facts and humour.

Don told us that there is a 2041 treaty in place which means that no country is allowed to exploit or build in Antarctica. However, as we know, the finite nature of resources on Earth means that some countries may be eager to exploit this after 2041. Robert Swan is keen to ensure that this does not happen and to help spread this message is encouraging schools to sign up to being a 2041 School, which we are eager to be.

#### Year 2 Multiskills
