Around school

This week has been time to catch our breath after World Book Day, Mother's Day and Shakespeare Rocks. It has been lovely to see the children being creative and having a number of opportunities to sketch, paint, cook and make as our Art and DT topics come towards their end goals for this term. The standards in these subjects are as high as other areas of the curriculum and it really is remarkable to see what the children produce. The electric light houses in Year 4, for example, combining the children's knowledge of science and DT, are wonderful.

Mrs Smith and I are huge advocates for Outdoor Learning and we got to see some excellent work by our Year 1s who cooked marshmallows and nachos over one of our fire pits. They were so sensible around the fire circle and had a fabulous time. We have invested a lot over recent years in equipment to support Outdoor Learning and I am sure that this is another thing the children will remember later in life about their time in primary school. Later that day, Year 2s made some brilliant outdoor artwork braving the Spring showers, based on the work of artist Richard Long.

Nursery have been busy learning how to be independent, practising things like turning their clothes the right way when they are inside out! They have been learning to cut carefully with scissors.

Year 3 have been writing some inspirational poetry including similes and metaphors. The standard of the work has really impressed us and the children certainly love poems.

I was impressed with the collages that our Year 5 children have made, each one unique and focused on different ecosystems and biomes. They were based on the work of Sieko Kato, who uses images from books, magazines and encyclopaedias in her work.

Reception have been learning in their changes topic about past and present. When I visited the class earlier, children were looking at photographs and deciding whether they were from the past or present day. They justified their choices brilliantly.

Year 6 had a brilliant day on Thursday making their curries from seasonal vegetables and eating them for this term's DT project. Some of the class mentioned that they may have added slightly too many spices! I doubt too many Year 6s get to do this in school at this time of year and it shows we do try to keep some kind of balance for the children, even in the run up to their end of key stage assessments.
