Public Health Messages

I attended a Headteacher briefing this week and one of the speakers was a representative from Public Health. Attendance

Over the past week, you may have noticed in the news further information from the government on school attendance and some worrying statistics, particularly around the number of children nationally who are classed as persistent absentees (where attendance is less than 90%). As a result, they have decreased the number of unauthorised absences allowed to 10 sessions (5 days) and periods of unauthorised absences such as these could result in a larger fixed penalty notice. This means that 5 school days holidays would fall into this bracket now so please consider this when arranging holidays for the next academic year.
