Educational Visits

The Summer Term and the topics studied by our different year groups offer us good opportunities to go on Educational Visits, These visits enhance topics and give our children the chance to see things first hand, such as artefacts from their History topics. Earth Day

Earth Day was celebrated with an assembly this week which Dr Blezard led. The theme for 2024 is "Planet v Plastics". It is encouraging countries, governments, organisations and individuals to take action to reduce plastic production by 60% by 2040.

Here are some incredible facts that we discussed:

- More than 500 billion plastic bags were produced worldwide in 2023. That is equal to one million bags per minute.
- Every square mile of the sea has more than 46,000 pieces of plastic in it.
- At least 11 million tons of plastic are dumped into our oceans every year. That is equal to dumping one refuse truck full of plastic into the ocean every minute.

We talked about the difference we could all make to our planet if we all pledged to make one difference. Suggestions given included swapping from a plastic to a bamboo toothbrush, using reusable bags and bottles, cooking only enough to eat to reduce food waste and walking, cycling or scooting for short journeys. We have set up a pledge tree in the hall to fill with our environmental pledges - together we can make a big difference!

Local History Group
