### The Water Safety Code (RoSPA)

With the warmer weather and the increased frequency of visits to rivers, lakes and beaches, it is important to remember the hazards and dangers water can pose, especially to children. Tragically there are fatalities every year, so I have taken this from a recent Health and Safety bulletin sent to school.

Spot the dangers! Water may look safe, but it can be dangerous. Learn to spot and keep away from dangers. You may swim well in a warm indoor pool, but that does not mean that you will be able to swim in cold water.

The dangers of water include:

- it is very cold
- there may be hidden currents
- it can be difficult to get out (steep slimy banks)
- it can be deep
- there may be hidden rubbish, e.g. shopping trolleys, broken glass

- there are no lifeguards
- it is difficult to estimate depth
- it may be polluted and may make you ill

Please keep children close to you and supervised at all times when in the local area or on holiday when around water over the coming weeks and months.
