One of the things that I am most proud of about our school is the balance between the amazing events we host, the opportunities we have in different areas of the curriculum and the continued, incredible academic success we enjoy. Once again this year, our end of year results are brilliant. In every assessment our children perform considerably better than national averages. In primary schools, these are Reception children's Good Level of Development judgements, Year 1 Phonics Screening, Year 4 Multiplication Check and Year 6 SATs.
