Attendance

I have been pleased with our strong attendance data this year which has helped our children reach their full potential. We can have the best teaching possible but if a child does not attend regularly their chances lessen considerably. A report released this month entitled Key Stage 2 Attainment and Life time Earnings showed the difference financially over a lifetime a positive start to education can bring. The knowledge, skills, learning behaviours and habits gained in primary schools make a huge difference to children's futures and is often underestimated. A handful of children have cumulative years of attendance of less than 90%, a day absent each fortnight. I really hope that this improves so all children can reach their full potential.
